Description of Tariff:

PCCW Convergence provides customer a VoIP fax line. Without having a fax machine, customer can make use of the assigned login name and password to send or receive fax via email through a designated administrative portal anytime and anywhere when customer has connection to Internet. Upon subscription of the service, the customer can enjoy the below fax usage per day:

Outgoing Fax Request per user per day	Destination per Request	File size limitation per fax transaction (Size:A4)
20	5	20 Pages

Customer has to subscribe or has already subscribed to at least one of the following business line* type in order to have such telephone number assigned as Convergence VoIP phone number. Through the administrative portal, customer can re-assign the Convergence VoIP phone number to another phone which is used for making outgoing calls initiated by the PCCW Convergence platform. Disregard which phone the customer uses to make telephone calls, the Convergence VoIP phone number will be displayed at the called party equipment.

Customer can enjoy the unified message feature of the service, which provides alert to customer on voicemails of one designated business line# and on messages received by one pre-registered email account via the administrative portal.
